Washington State faces the 2nd highest earthquake risk in the nation. Are you prepared? Register to participate in The Great Washington ShakeOut and learn how to conduct your own earthquake and tsunami evacuation drills. www.shakeout.org/washington

The Great Washington ShakeOut is the third Thursday of October (October 19th, 2023). It is being organized to encourage YOU and your neighbors to review and update emergency preparedness plans and supplies, and to prepare your home to prevent damage and injuries. If the 19th doesn't work for you, you can ShakeOut when and where you want, even by video conference. You can have your drill on any other day.

Here's a short list of essentials to start with: Food and water for 14 days, warm clothes, an out of state contact, flashlights and first aid kit.

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

ASSESSMENT PAYMENT REMINDER



Quarterly assessment payments are due on the 1st of the following months January, April, July, and October. Monthly assessments for Sub-Divisions are also due on the 1st of each month. If you use online bill pay to pay your assessments, you need to allow at least 7 to 10 days processing time. Please include your 5-digit account number shown on your coupon book.

If you pay assessments to the Association as well as to a Sub-Division, please issue two separate payments.

DID YOU KNOW YOU HAVE OPTIONS WHEN MAKING YOUR ASSESSMENT PAYMENT?

Recurring payment online (no need to remember to write a check) – Sign up for recurring payments online at www.hoacommunitysolutions.com. Click on Pay Online, create an account and schedule your recurring payments using your checking account. When setting up your recurring payments you will need the following Information: Your Banking Information – bank account and routing numbers, Management Company ID – 6835, Community Code – see codes below, and your 5-digit account number. Your account number can be found on your payment coupon or by contacting the Association Office.

Mail in your payment – Submit your payment using a personal check or through your bank's online bill pay services. Information you will need to include on your check: Community Code – see codes below, and your 5-digit account number (*Example MCWO* – *98367*). One-time E-Check, Debit or Credit Card – Make a one-time payment online at www.hoacommunitysolutions.com. Click on Pay Online and then One Time Payment. A FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM YOUR DESIGN REVIEW COMMITTEE

Now that Fall and Winter are upon us, residents will no doubt be taking the opportunity to prep and maintain their homes for the upcoming cold season around the exterior of your home which may need to be addressed:

Exterior of your house: Does the roof require repair or replacement? Is the siding looking worn or

faded? Does the home need to be pre-winterized prior to the cold season?

Shrubs/bushes: Do they need to be trimmed or replaced? Do they need extra care to assist

for any possible snow? Certain plants do tend to like a nice "sweater" for the

cold.

Yard care: Has debris such as tree limbs, rocks and dead grass collected in your yard

or in the rockery?

Clutter: Are there unscreened items stored at the front or side of your home?

Exterior lighting & Decorations:

The holiday season will soon be upon us, and we respectfully remind all homeowners that exterior seasonal lights must fall within community standards. Lighting may be displayed during the holidays October 25th through January 5th but please be considerate of your neighbors and turn your lights off between the hours of 11:00pm and 6:00am.

Exterior lighting for other events throughout the year may be displayed the day prior and the day of, but must be removed or turned off the following day.

Concealed exterior lighting may be permanently installed on homes with

DRC application and approval.

Exterior decorations during the holiday season may be displayed no more than 45 days prior to the holiday and must be removed within 30 days after

the holiday.

Mailboxes: No signs, advertising or any other matter may be affixed to mailboxes.

Doing so will mark and eventually destroy the exterior surface of the boxes.

Parks: The Association office is no longer taking reservations for use of the

> community parks. The parks are open to all homeowners from dawn to dusk during all seasons, however, guests may not use the parks without residents

in attendance.

Trash cans: Make sure your trash cans are screened and not visible from the street and

> pulled in accordingly per the trash/recycling schedule. Your Board of Directors has adopted new regulations for some of the new areas in McCormick Woods with optional screening. Make sure you read the ACR

changes recently mailed to all homeowners.

You may not appropriate any additional parking places on your property or Parking:

park any vehicles in common areas.

Please remember to submit a Design Review Application if you are considering any projects that alter the exterior appearance of your home. Submitting Design Review Applications has never been easier! Residents may now submit their application online with a click of a button. You may find the form on the Association website at http://www.mccormickwoodshoa.com click on the Resource tab, and then on Applications and Forms.



After clicking on the link, enter your address and zip code to be taken to the application screen. Once you have completed the form, simply click the submit button and your application is sent to the Association office! You will receive additional updates via email regarding the status of your application.

GREEN SPACES

LIVING ON A GOLF COURSE

As winter arrives, foliage protection from the golf course becomes sparser. Less foliage may mean more golf balls find their way onto residential property. When this happens, please remember, golfers are permitted to retrieve their golf balls from residential property.

Section 6.22(c) of the CC&R's states that Owners of Lots abutting the Golf Course recognize and accept the risk that golfers will occasionally misplay golf balls into lots. Golfers will be permitted to retrieve such balls without interference. Golfers will not be permitted to play balls which leave the golf course but must retrieve their ball and "drop" it in an appropriate location on the golf course. The Golf Course operator will endeavor to alert all golfers to this course rule.

Part of the Association's responsibility is simply reminding residents of procedures or policies they may not be aware of. Our intent is to strike a balance between the best

interest of individual residents and those of the community as a whole, including the McCormick Woods Golf Course. With that being said, the Association is respectfully requesting that residents on golf course lots take a moment to familiarize themselves with the policy set forth in the CC&R's. In addition, we ask that golfers respect residents' property when retrieving their stray golf balls.
