City Snow Routes & McCormick Woods Snow Removal Policy

When it snows the city will concentrate their efforts on plowing the primary routes first to accommodate fire, medical and police response, as well as Kitsap Transit, school buses and commuter traffic. As long as it continues to snow, these primary routes will be plowed. Once the snow has stopped and all primary roads are clear, plows will move to secondary routes and once those are cleared plows will move to local access and residential roads. If it starts snowing again, the process for clearing main roads will start over. Please keep in mind that during a heavy, continuous snowstorm, it may take several days before all city streets are cleared.

Please take note that when it does snow, parking on these roadways is prohibited (even if street parking is legal at other times). So, if you park on one of these routes and snow is in the forecast, it would be wise to move your vehicle to another location in advance so that your car is not towed.

Preparing For Winter

Use the Take Winter by Storm Checklist to prepare an emergency kit, including a radio, flashlight, extra batteries, first-aid kit, emergency contact information, water, and non-perishable food. You can find a detailed list, helpful tips, sign up to receive alerts and much more at <https://TakeWinterByStorm.org>.

Here's what to do when the mercury drops:

- A trickle of hot and cold water might be all it takes to keep your pipes from freezing. Let warm water drip overnight, preferably from a faucet on an outside wall.
- Open cabinet doors to allow heat to get to un-insulated pipes under sinks and appliances near exterior walls.
- Clear your sidewalk of snow and ice with salt, deicer and/or snow shoveling to avoid injuries on your property.
- Keep snow build-up off surfaces that could collapse.

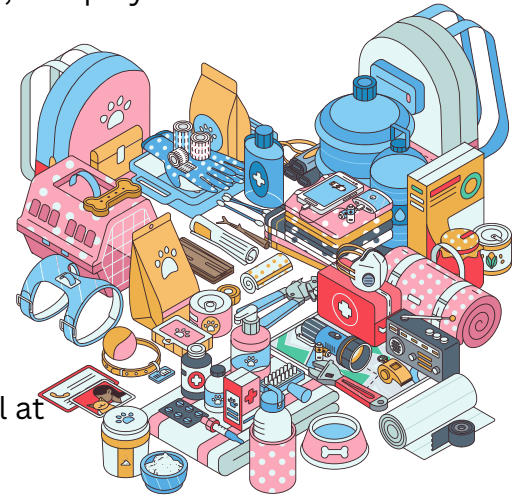

Emergency Preparedness

Are you prepared for an emergency? Many threats and hazards are possible in Kitsap County. And unfortunately, there are limited resources to address all possible emergencies. That's why everyone has a responsibility to get prepared. The Kitsap County Department of Emergency Management (KCDEM) recommends that anyone who lives, works, and plays here follow these steps:

1. Learn about local disasters
 - a. Kitsap County is at high risk for a major earthquake
2. Have a Plan
 - a. Decide as a group where your meeting locations are and who your out-of-area contacts.
3. Build a Kit
 - a. The first step is to build a 2 weeks ready kit at home.
4. Prepare in a year
 - a. Don't have the time or money to become prepared all at once? We recommend you take it in smaller steps

Development Updates!



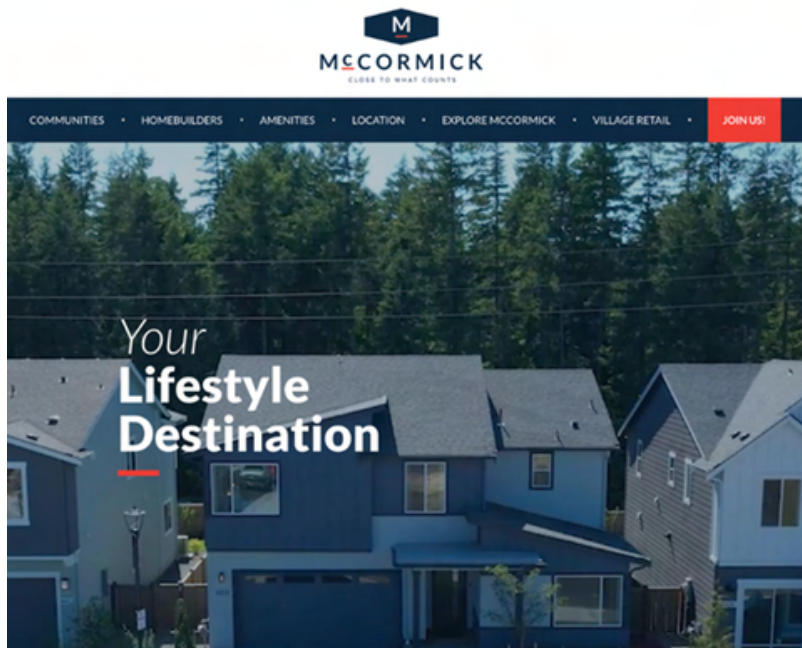

ASSESSMENT PAYMENT REMINDER

Quarterly assessment payments are due on the 1st of the following months January, April, July, and October. Monthly assessments for Sub-Divisions are also due on the 1st of each month. If you use online bill pay to pay your assessments, you need to allow at least 7 to 10 days processing time. Please include your 5-digit account number shown on your coupon book.



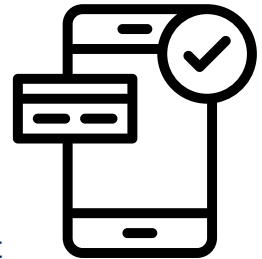
If you pay assessments to the Association as well as to a Sub-Division, please issue two separate payments.

We have so much enjoyed your beautiful holiday decorations and exterior lighting, however, now that the holidays are almost behind us, we must respectfully remind you that holiday decorations as well as exterior lighting, other than DRC approved concealed lighting, must be removed by January 31st in order to conform to McCormick Woods regulations.

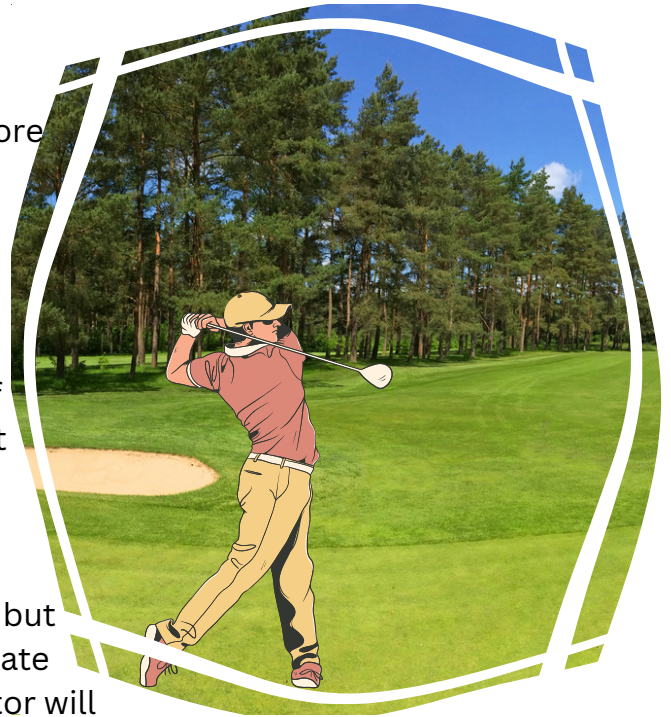

Living on a Golf Course

As winter arrives, foliage protection from the golf course becomes sparser. Less foliage may mean more golf balls find their way onto residential property. When this happens, please remember, golfers are permitted to retrieve their golf balls from residential property.

Section 6.22(c) of the CC&R's states that Owners of Lots abutting the Golf Course recognize and accept the risk that golfers will occasionally misplay golf balls into lots. Golfers will be permitted to retrieve such balls without interference. Golfers will not be permitted to play balls which leave the golf course but must retrieve their ball and "drop" it in an appropriate location on the golf course. The Golf Course operator will endeavor to alert all golfers to this course rule.



Part of the Association's responsibility is simply reminding residents of procedures or policies they may not be aware of. Our intent is to strike a balance between the best interest of individual residents and those of the community as a whole, including the McCormick Woods Golf Course. With that being said, the Association is respectfully requesting that residents on golf course lots take a moment to familiarize themselves with the policy set forth in the CC&R's. In addition, we ask that golfers respect residents' property when retrieving their stray golf balls.

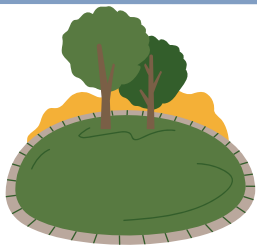

New Connecting Trails

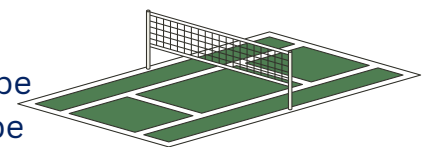

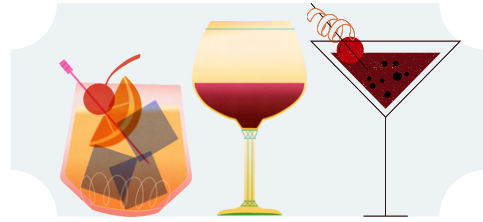

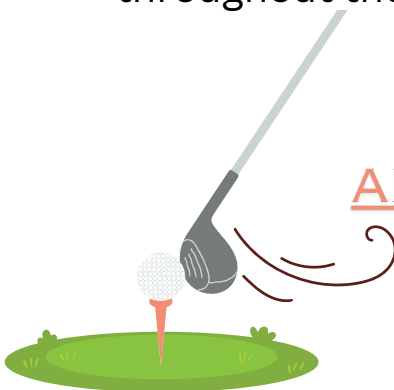

McCormick Woods Women's Golf Club offers opportunities for women of all skill levels to play golf in a fun and comfortable atmosphere.

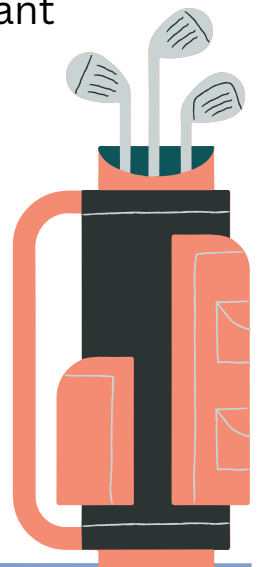

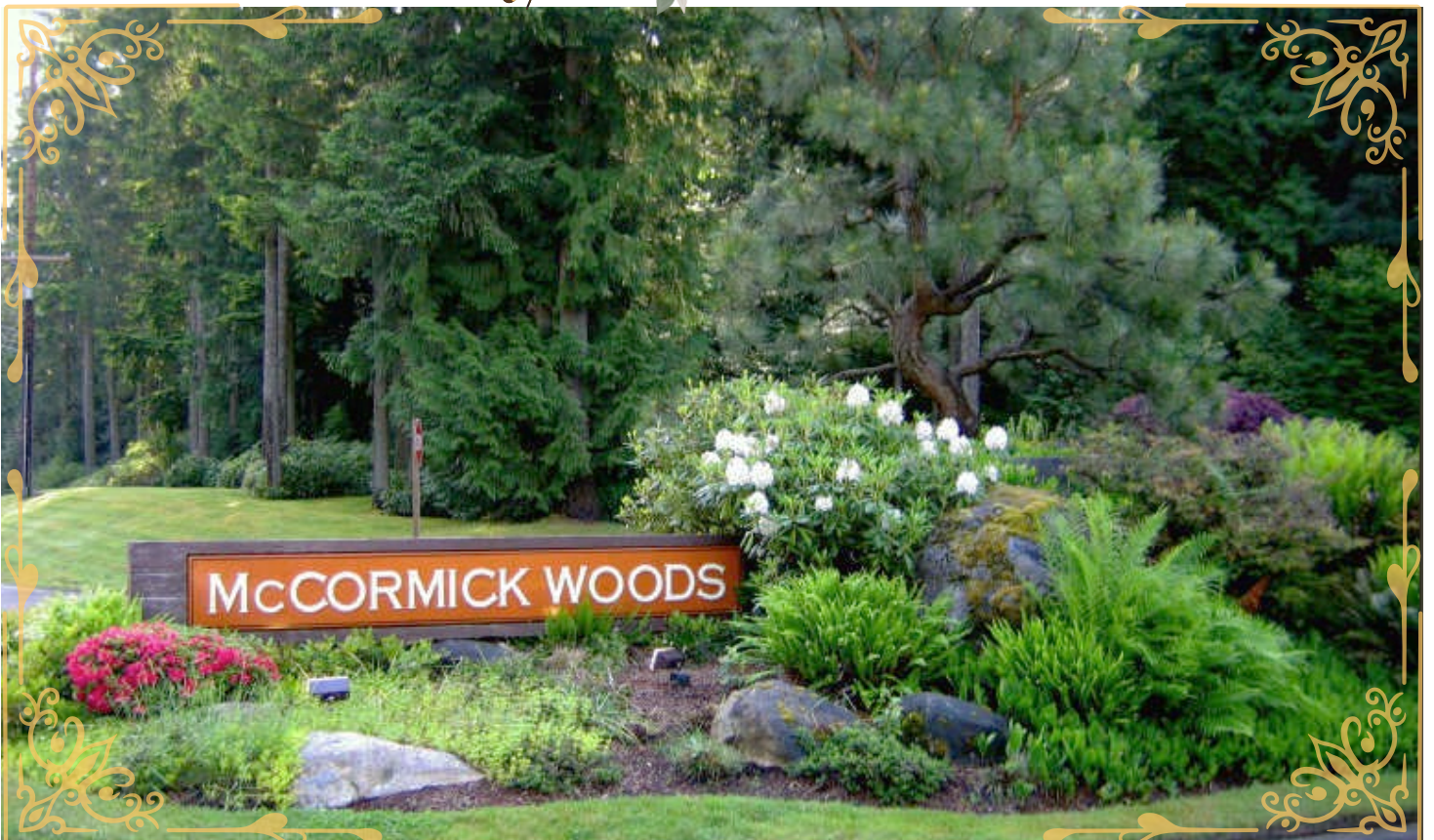
